#### **Letter from Pastor Richard**

#### **Changes**

#### **Greetings from Doreen**

The Bible offers this advice: 'It is good to wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord.'

Our world is so noisy – the media chatter, natter, clatter continually about death, destruction, deviation, devastation, dilemma, degradation (phew!) – that it requires great determination to just 'Be still, and know that I am God'! And yet, amongst all the social spite and splatter, the splendour of God's presenve never changes, or fails. The Bible declares, 'Because of the Lord's great love, we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning. Great is YOUR faithfulness.'

The personal pronoun 'your', refers to the Lord, which is why I have put it in capital letters – but it can also be applied to those of us who are Christians – maybe followed by a question mark?

Consider this true story. We have a young friend who works in Ethiopia, in a missionary youth centre. Groups of young people from the city, street kids, a contact with a school for the deaf, make for a busy outreach. Then, in the spring, the local Science and Technology Bureau proposed to take over the youth centre site, and suddenly, the Christian work seemed to be surplus! What to do, now? They did not argue with authority, or organise a petition, or complain about the way in which their care and concern for young people was being ignored. They prayed – and organised other people to pray. I quote from a letter received in August: 'There has been great news. We have heard definitely that a different site has been chosen by the Bureau, and so our work can continue!'

If we, here in Upper Trosnant, take God at His word, and begin to pray and witness faithfully for His names sake – what might happen here?

#### **Christmas is Coming!**

Upper Trosnant has been supporting the work of Operation Christmas Child for many years now. The number of Shoeboxes that have set off from our small church, brightly wrapped and packed with gifts, must run into many hundreds! We may not know the names of the children who have received them, but we do know that each box has gone to a boy or girl who would otherwise have received nothing for Christmas – children in orphanages, hospitals, refugee camps, and poor communities where families struggle to find the basic necessities of life.

Many individuals have helped – but the great mainstay of Upper Trosnant's work for Operation Christmas Child has for many years been Audrey Jones, who has worked tirelessly distributing leaflets, wrapping boxes, knitting toys, hats and mittens, arranging spare gift items for swaps on the table in Hall, coordinating the collection and dispatch of the boxes to the local depot, and taking charge of the money needed to send them on their journey. Audrey will be a very hard act to follow since she and Eric moved to Oxfordshire - nonetheless, the ladies of Sisterhood are determined that Operation Christmas Child (Upper Trosnant) will continue to happen, so this year I will be taking over the role of organiser. Meanwhile, if you are planning on filling a box this year, here are some key things to remember:

#### **How to pack a Shoebox**

Samaritan's purse ask us to pack presents for children in three age groups -2-4, 5-9, or 10-14- and to choose items that are appropriate for either a boy or a girl of that age. The ideal size is the box of a woman's shoe 6- a little larger is fine, but a boot box or a man's trainers box, for example, is too big. There are many special offers and bargains to be had as children go back to school this month.

Samaritan's purse suggest items from the following list:

- **Toys**: include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls or stuffed toys (with CE label), toy cars and trucks, harmonica, yo-yo, skipping rope, ball, small puzzles...
- **School Supplies**: Pens, pencils & sharpeners, crayons or felt pens, chalks, stamps & ink pad sets, writing pads or notebooks & paper, solar-powered calculators, colouring & picture books...
- **Hygiene items**: Toothbrush and toothpaste, bars of wrapped soap, comb or hairbrush, flannel...
- **Other items**: Hat, cap, gloves or scarf, sunglasses, hair accessories, jewellery set, wind up torch, wrapped sweets (best-before-date must be at least March 2019).

#### **Items that we cannot send as gifts**

There are some items that we are not allowed to send. **Please do NOT include**: second-hand or damaged items; war related items such as toy guns, play soldiers or knives; chocolate [it melts!] or other food items besides sweets; liquids or lotions of any type including bubbles; medicines; hand-made or knitted stuffed toys [because the stuffing cannot be checked]; anything of a political, racial or religious nature; sharp objects; glass containers, mirrors or fragile items; playing cards of the 4-suit variety; clothing other than as listed above.

#### Don't Forget to swap and share!

Even though we will be short of space in the Vestry while the building work is going on outside the Hall, we will be coordinating the swapping and sharing of surplus or extra items. Perhaps you have bought an item and stationery and received another one free? Or do you have any empty shoeboxes that you could you bring them along for somebody else to fill up? Our wonderful team of knitters meanwhile, will be making hats, mittens, glove puppets and bags to suit all ages and sizes for us all to include in our boxes.

And finally, please share the news of Operation Christmas Child with your friends, colleagues or neighbours; they are very welcome to contribute a box too. The Service of Blessing will be held in November – date to be announced in the next newsletter!

# **GSUS LIVE – Your Questions Answered**

#### What is GSUS Live?

GSUS Live is a mobile education unit which is a multi-media classroom in a lorry trailer. It tells the story of three teenagers facing real-life issues in their lives, and how they get inspiration from the Bible to deal with their problems. Using touch-screen computers, participants can interact with fictional characters through animations, instant chat, short educational films and music videos. GSUS Live explores what Jesus taught about the themes of fear, forgiveness and rejection, and explains the central belief of Christianity – why Jesus died and rose again.

#### Who is it for?

GSUS Live is designed for secondary school pupils in Key Stage 3 – that is, children aged 11-14, in Years 7, 8, and 9. It is a popular and trustworthy RE resource created by professionals. Famous public figures such as Martin Luther King and Malala Yousafzai feature in the short films. Visiting GSUS Live complements existing teaching in the RE and PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) syllabuses.

#### How do they get to see it?

GSUS Live is housed on a purpose-built trailer which arrives in the school car park and transforms into a large interactive learning space. The trailer weighs in at 14 tonnes and when fully deployed occupies an area approximately the length of 6 car parking spaces! Children with special educational needs are provided for, and there is a wheelchair lift to allow access for all.

#### Who Runs GSUS Live and how much does it cost?

GSUS Live is a core outreach activity provided by Counties Evangelism. It has already been used in over 800 UK secondary schools since 2000 and visited by around 500,000 pupils. There are two mobile units which in 2016 were given a £150,000 upgrade. It costs approximately £1,000 a week to run, but – amazingly – it is FREE for schools to use because the visit is sponsored by Counties, and other donor partners including a Christian grant-making trust. GSUS Live also relies on donations from churches and individuals, and on local volunteer staff.

#### Which schools are taking part?

GSUS Live will be in our area between 10 September and 26 October. It will be at the following schools:

Blackwood Comprehensive 10-14 September West Monmouth School 17-21 September Rougemont School 24-28 September Ysgol Gyfun Gwynllyw 1-5 October King Henry  $8^{th}$ , Abergavenny Cyfartha School, Merthyr 15-19 October Pen y Dre High School, 22-26 October Merthyr

#### Why are volunteers needed and what do they have to do?

Counties staff do not stay with the unit, but they provide full training and support to local organisers who take charge of day-to-day operations. This is a great way for churches like Upper Trosnant to build lasting relationships with local comprehensive schools and young people. Volunteers are needed to undertake all sorts of roles, from welcoming each group of children and keeping the unit tidy, to helping with the equipment, introducing sessions, and answering questions that may arise. Nobody is expected to volunteer for the whole six weeks – but do you have a day or two to give while GSUS Live is in Torfaen? The training afternoon is at Blackwood on Saturday 8 September from 1–3 pm. Please speak to me if you would like to help.

#### I will pray for GSUS Live. What are the greatest needs?

Please pray for the thousands of pupils and teachers who will visit GSUS Live in our area. Pray that the presenters will communicate clearly what the Bible teaches, and pray for a lasting impact on the young people. Pray for the safety and security of each session, and that the hardware and software will run smoothly. Most of all, pray for the building of ongoing relationships between churches and schools.
